The Promise House Dedicated in West Greenville

A Dedication Service and Open House was held at “The Promise House” on Sunday afternoon, November 18.

“The Promise House,” located at 212 Gower Street in West Greenville, will serve as transitional housing for homeless families through Greenville Area Interfaith Hospitality Network (GAIHN).

“The Promise House” is a ministry collaboration of St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church, Buncombe Street United Methodist Church, Covenant United Methodist Church, and St. Matthew United Methodist Church, in partnership with the Sisters of Charity Foundation of SC, Central Community Ministries (CCM), Furman University Athletics (Football and Women’s Soccer), Greenville County Redevelopment Authority (GCRA), the City of Greenville, Hollingsworth Funds, Inc., Upstate Homeless Coalition of SC, and GAIHN.
